



2009 ACLU of Hawaii Legislative Report Card

MAUI COUNTY

The ACLU of Hawaii compiled legislators' votes in 2009 on over 85 bills and resolutions impacting civil rights and found that Maui legislators often vote in support of civil rights. In fact, Maui legislators generally supported the ACLU of Hawaii's legislative priorities: civil unions were supported by all Maui legislators except for Sen. Tsutsui and Rep. McKelvey; a bill to require emergency rooms to offer emergency contraception to sexual assault survivors was supported by all but Rep. Souki, who favored a religious organization exemption; voting rights for incarcerated individuals were supported by all Maui legislators and a bill to eliminate mandatory minimum sentences for non-violent offenders was supported by all Maui legislators but Sen. Tsutsui. Consult the chart below to see how your legislators voted on civil rights issues and ask them to vote in support of future civil rights bills in the Hawaii State Legislature.
